The Sunbridge Institute – SUNY Empire State College Partnership

- Provides a pathway to earn a Master of Education in Curriculum & Instruction or Master of Arts in Liberal Studies with a self-designed concentration in Waldorf Education through Prior Learning Evaluation (PLE).
- Twelve elective credits—comprising the entire Waldorf Education concentration—awarded to SUNY Empire graduate students in these programs who provide official transcripts documenting their completion of the Waldorf Early Childhood or Elementary teacher education programs.
- Orientation fee waiver; \$100 Presidential Scholarship during the first term of matriculated enrollment.

(Note: New York State residency is not required.)

NYSED Title IIa Tuition Waivers

The New York State Education Department (NYSED) and SUNY Empire State College have partnered to make Title II Part A funds available to non-public teachers and administrators who wish to pursue graduate-level education coursework for the purposes of professional development.

Eligible nonpublic teacher's assistants, teachers, and administrators may enroll in up to 12 credits of coursework that support the development of pedagogical skills, leadership ability, support for high quality academic standards, increased content knowledge, and delivery strategies in order to enhance the academic achievement and socioemotional development of students in nonpublic schools in NYS.
